

Centre for Global Law and Governance, University of St Andrews Call for internship applications, 2021-22

The Centre for Global Law and Governance is pleased to announce its call for interns for the 2021-22 academic year. We are seeking motivated students with interests in the Centre's core areas of research concerning global governance, international law, institutions, and constitutionalism as applied to a wide range of issues including security, human rights, trade, refugees and migration, and the environment. Due to the ongoing Coronavirus pandemic, the internship will be conducted remotely. Centre events and meetings will be held online during fall 2021 semester. Students who plan to reside outside of St Andrews for this academic year are welcome to apply.

The internship offers an opportunity to work with IR faculty and fellow students to further develop research, writing, and presentation skills. Each intern will research and write an original essay on a topic of their choosing, under the general theme of "global environmental governance," in consultation with the CGLG directors and a PhD academic mentor. The resulting essays are published in our annual *Junior Scholar Working Paper Series*. Interns also help to promote the Centre's work within the School of IR, university, and local community.

Internship timeline

Applicants should be aware that the internship will operate differently in 2021-22, with most activities occurring in Martinmas semester. Interns will need to dedicate time over the fall and during the winter break to research and write the first draft of their essay. We will convene an internal peer feedback workshop (online) in pre-sessional week of Candlemas semester with final revised essays due in Week 2 (January 2022). It is important, therefore, that prospective applicants consider whether this timeline is compatible with their academic and extra-curricular commitments.

Application procedure

All interested undergraduate and post-graduate taught students are encouraged to apply. The internship is only open to currently registered students attending St Andrews this academic year. Please submit the following items **in one document** to cglg@st-andrews.ac.uk:

1. CV
2. Statement of interest (no more than one A4 page) outlining (a) your goals for the internship and how the experience would benefit your academic and professional development; and (b) what you would (broadly) like to research on the topic of *global environmental governance*.

The deadline for applications is **5pm (UK time) on Friday, 24 September**. Applicants will be contacted individually, by email, soon after to convey the outcome.
